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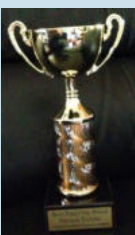

Other members promoting our breed on the show circuit are Chris Wiseman (Garthowen), Sharryn Hilton and John Ferguson (Fullcircle), Peter and Christine Gunczy (Christernee) and recently new member Helen Haines (Knockfin) with some beautiful kittens sired by Awesome Gem out of a Kalinya choc pt. Lealjo Saralee bred by Joan Wright is also competing strongly in the QFA Northern Division Shorthair Kittens section.

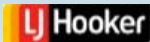

Our thanks to Grant and Penny for their years of "garaging" our club property and to John and Sharryn for providing its next home. Sadly after some 30+ years of service our trailer is in need of repairs to make it completely roadworthy. This service/repair is being arranged by John Ferguson at a Picton outlet and by next FELIS we will be able to confirm we have almost a new trailer and the cost of making good, including registration.

This is generating quite a lot of traffic with links to our SCS website, managed by Peter Gunczy (Christernee Cattery). Kalinya Siamese does



Following a recommendation by our SCS Secretary Sharryn Hilton, I was contacted by the Production Assistant of Better Homes and Gardens enquiring whether or not Bev and I would be interested in doing a segment on Siamese with Dr Harry Cooper. It was to be a period segment about things that were popular in the 1970's, of which the Siamese cat was one and their changing style.

With filming scheduled for Wednesday 29th April, it was agreed that we would attend along with our 14 weeks old seal point litter (2 males, 2 females), our eight years old choc point spay and our almost two years old "borrowed but bred" seal point spay. Filming was at Dural on a rented private home set on quite a few acres with the initial shoot time 2.00pm – 5.00pm. When shoot time was brought forward to 10.00am I decided to take the full day off work as we had to depart home at 7.45am.

Upon arrival filming was underway with Dr Harry road testing the Afghan Hound. A couple of majestic hounds groomed to perfection were running up and down the landscape then stopped with owner to have a chat with Dr Harry. We were ushered inside the home which was very spacious & as well as secured to prevent escaping Siamese. Pet crates were then opened to let the tribe explore their new surroundings. As expected, caution was with most of the Kalinya travellers, but there is & was always one who couldn't care less & just walked around as if she owned the place. That is our Kalinya OM Jemma who featured on the segment & is pictured in this article. She is also this year's Joyce Selby Award & LJ Hooker-Picton Award winner !! It was unfortunate as can be seen in the picture that her haws are up. Don't know why & neither did Dr Harry as she was a picture of health, not on any treatments nor any apparent stress. Possibility of being sensitive to lights and there were plenty of those at the filming is the only explanation.

The obligatory signing of contract and payment schedules completed, it was time for a briefing of what was to happen given by the Producer's assistant. It all seemed pretty straightforward and also appeared to not be going to take too much time. How wrong we were!!

With the Afghan hound shoot running over time, the extended time gave the litter kittens added confidence to run and chase and to play with the three young children who resided at this address. They had been allowed the day off school to watch the shoot and to experience Siamese cats, a breed which was under consideration for adding to their household along with a dog also yet to be chosen. As midday approached, the film crew arrived inside. The producer briefed Dr Harry on his expectations. Lighting & camera crews did their thing then our host provided a light morning tea after which all in attendance other than crew, Dr Harry and our Siamese were then asked to adjourn to another room out of sight of the filming. This was to eliminate shadows etc infiltrating the film scene and to keep the Siamese more attentive and responsive.

With the Dr Harry shoot completed it was now time to film the kittens playing and interacting with the children. Finding the right light and scene then became a major task again taking so much time. Eventually enough filming was achieved with only a shoot required of a Siamese walking along the very long dining room table. Cerami, our young female kitten, obliged with some at times fast faced walks as well as misguided, misdirected walks. However the producer eventually was satisfied.

It was now 3.00pm and time to pack up and head back home after what was such a long day. As so often happens when travelling Siamese, they are all talk going to but curl up & go to sleep for the return trip. We arrived home around 5.30pm just in time to feed all our animals.

We must say that the final airing of the shoot on Friday 8th July was quite disappointing given the amount of time invested by Kalinya Siamese. Particularly disappointed with Dr Harry's comments that in his opinion Siamese are not suited to a household with children. He had mentioned this to me at the shoot to which I gave him the obvious reply that like all animals it is about the breeding, the breeders and the environment in which they are reared. As he himself has bred Siamese, Oriental and Burmese decades ago, I reminded him that responsible breeders will ensure the right kitten is selected to best suit the environment in to which they are to rehome inclusive of awareness of transport requirements. He accepted my comments yet still presented his opinion on the BH&G segment. At the end of July and as promised, we received a DVD of the entire BH&G show, which coupled with a small \$200.00 gratuity payment, went a small way to reward us for our efforts.

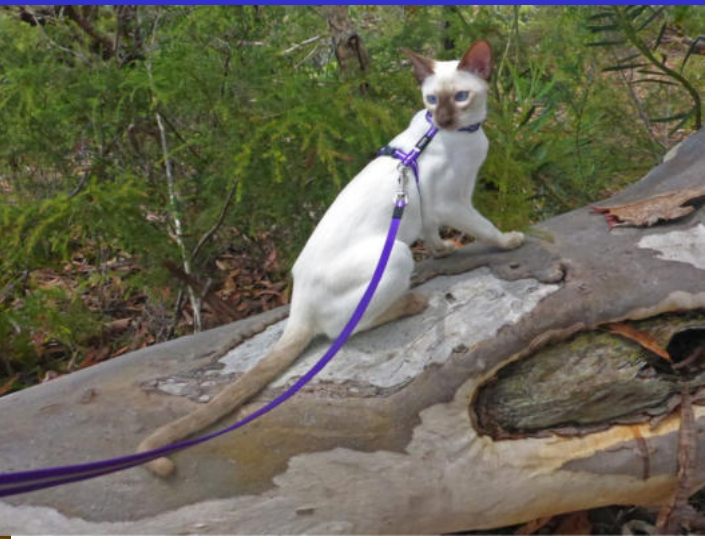

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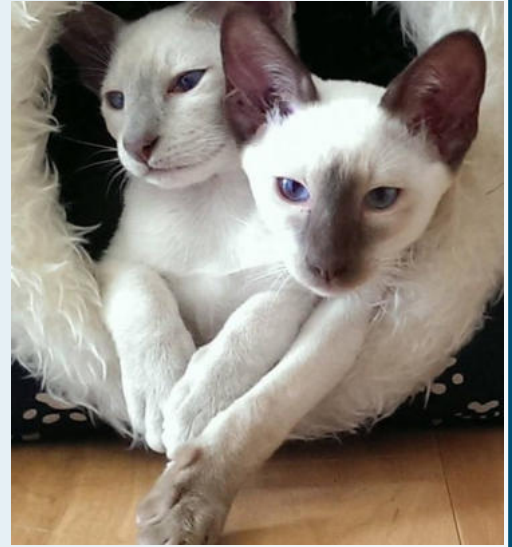

The Tale of Two Cats

As I surfed the internet searching for the perfect puppy, I vaguely recall my husband singing the praises of a cat. I say vaguely because a cat was nowhere on my radar. I was just nodding and responding randomly to him as I fell in love with one puppy after another appearing on my computer screen. I think he sensed I was placating him and so he sat down next to me and started watching cat videos on YouTube. This went on most evenings for about a month. I would watch an adorable puppy video and he would trump me with an even better cat clip. His YouTube cats were certainly far more interesting than the cat my mother had when I was young. My memory of having a cat was that it sat on a perch like a statue, unmoved by noise or people. As I came and went from the family home to attend university, I only knew my mother's cat still existed by the food bowls in the kitchen.



My husband told me about his cat Coco, an affectionate Siamese girl who followed him everywhere, curled up on his computer monitor when he worked and put her head on his pillow at night. I was sure he was romanticising his memory of this cat as I had never seen a cat do such things.

We searched the internet for a Siamese breeder and found *Fullcircle Siamese Cattery* only 30 minutes from our Bowral home. My husband thought I should spend some time with the Siamese to let me see for myself. We contacted Sharryn and stopped in to visit her on a Sunday afternoon. It wasn't long before her beautiful brood were brushing up against our legs and curled up on our laps. These Siamese cats were very different to the cats my mother had. Sharryn said they had "Puss-onalities" and she wasn't kidding. They looked me in the eye, engaged me and were curious and affectionate. I think we stayed all afternoon and enjoyed meeting Dejavu and Oashie, who were expecting a litter. 'Javu was gentle and loving and would be a wonderful mother.

As we drove home we talked excitedly about the possibility of adding a cat to our home and my husband offered more stories of his years with Coco.

Several weeks later Sharryn at *Fullcircle Siamese* contacted us to say Dejavu had given birth to four kittens. Once they were a little bigger, we stopped for a visit. The kittens were, of course, adorable. Four little white balls of fur with unsteady legs and barely open eyes. It was fun to watch them venture out of their comfort zone and around the lounge room, some more steady and self assured than others. REGISTERED BREEDERS VS. BACKYARD



There has been a heating up of discussions in local councils as to what should be allowed in animal breeding including cats and dogs. The amount of unwanted animals is at an all time record and the sadness of having to euthanase so many innocent souls per year is causing outrage not only from animal activists, but the general public who care about this as well.

Responsible breeders who are truly caring of their progeny that has been lovingly produced, have a return policy in place when placing their kittens into the initial home.

Most breeders are now also insisting on having their little ones neutered prior to their

placement.

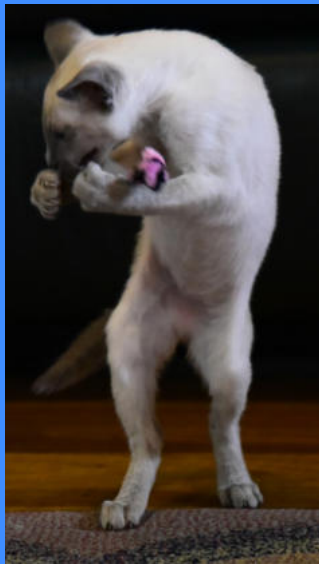
It appears that if the breeder isn't already doing this the local councils are soon going to insist on this occurring and are now investigating on implementing this rule.

Hopefully, this will negate the backyard breeder who in some cases, is happy to have their queen permanently pregnant so their sale of kittens is prolific. No-one is suggesting only pure breed cats are acceptable! A person can become a registered breeder for domestic mixed cats.

The amount of animals who are either surrendered, lost, stolen, or just allowed to be neglected

is astonishing. The average council throughout Australia has to implement a kill order for far too many animals everyday. People should be aware from where their animals are obtained, the amount of puppy and kitten farms should be shut down.

The backyard breeder does not have to supply the infant kitten or pup with vaccinations, micro-chip, worming or any other sort of protection to the animal. The kittens often suffer rickets, or worse in disease or infections. The bargain kitten often has fleas, disease or may end up being pregnant, dumped or even both and homeless. Then the cycle just continues...



SIAMESE RESCUES ON THE RISE

As the Secretary of Siamese Cat Society this year, and the current editor of the Felis as well as a Registered Breeder of our beloved Pure Siamese, I have become privy to a lot more of what is happening in the wide world of cats!!

It is usual for the respectable

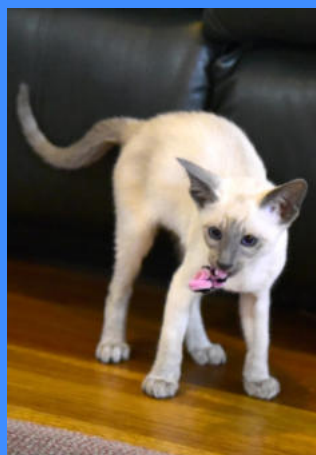

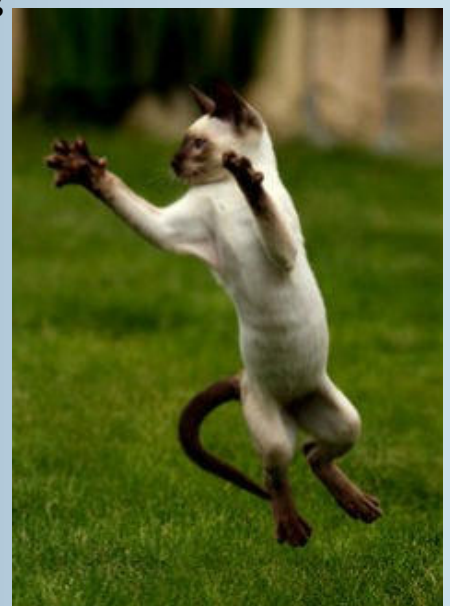
So he prayed to the Lord " Please God let this kitten be in your keeping".

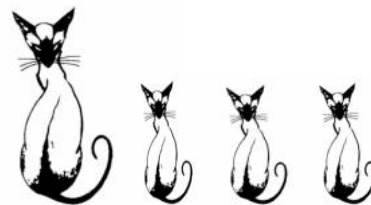
