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From the Editor

Presented at the AGM, 1 February 2020.

2019 was a year that saw some new faces on committee helping to share the workload necessary to manage both the administration of the Society and promote our Siamese. In particular, my thanks to Claire Watson our Treasurer for relieving Sharon Black of her multi- role as Secretary/ Treasurer/Social Media Moderator and to Marion Anstis for accepting the new role as Assistant Secretary and providing so much vigour and enthusiasm in achieving timely communication in this role.

Speaking of communication, it was very pleasing to see our first three newsletters (a shortened version of FELIS) compiled and distributed to members and made available also via our SCS website. Many thanks to Marion Anstis for using her editorial skills to meet deadlines in providing our membership, advertisers and Siamese enthusiasts a publication all about Siamese cats. To continue this Newsletter we do require matters of interest to be used in future Newsletters. No matter how big or small your article may be, please allow our Editor to consider your document. The other key matter which was communicated excellently by Sharon Black was regarding the new NSW Laws for Members and Breeders, 2019. So well-detailed was Sharon's overview article in our July Newsletter, that Cats NSW asked to use it to communicate to its members. A difficult task with so many inconsistencies between government departments etc., but all brought together with agreed facts. Job well done Sharon!!

Our committee in 2019 decided to invest in two different term deposits \$10k and \$5k whilst holding approximately \$3k in its working account. This continues to maintain our SCS in a sound financial position. Yields from the term deposit will fund the Lesley Bourke Memorial award for Best Personality "Pure" Siamese exhibit.

Well done to the SCS committee, in particular Sharryn Hilton, John Ferguson, Sharon Black and Claire Watson in completing the sale of all SCS show cages and finalising the sale of our trailer, all of which helped to swell our bank balance.

Proudly, our Siamese earned some recognition and achieved good results at both ACF and CCCA Nationals held in Sydney in 2019. Exhibitors/breeders to achieve success were Sandra Sweetman (Shiloh), Gallagher Family (Astraxalotte), Sharryn Hilton and John Ferguson (Fullcircle), Chris Wiseman (Garthowen) and Tony and Bev Hurry (Kalinya).

Let's hope that 2020 Nationals (Perth and Melbourne) can attract some of our members to promote our Siamese.

It is fair to say our SCS "pure" Siamese exhibition and competition, as part of the Cats NSW February 2019 show, was a disappointing event. Although we had 24 exhibits, little opportunity was given by the show's management to engage an audience and to present and promote our breed and those successful on the day. We all must make an effort this year to rectify this and to take better control and to participate.

My thanks again to our media administrators Peter Gunczy (website) and Sharon Black (Facebook) for their efforts in 2019. Potential customers continue to be brought in via these media outlets.

Congratulations and thank you to those members who enjoyed show success, and importantly exhibited and promoted our Siamese breed. Catteries to excel were **Astraxalotte, Shiloh, Kalinya, Lookatmese, Ecumene** and **Garthowen**.

Whilst I am talking of breeders, I remind each of you that the **PRA** disease is still required to be managed. My records show some breeders have either yet to have had testing done, or if they have had it done, results have not been forwarded to me. Yes, it can be bred out of your lines, however I believe that SCS members in working together can best manage to remove it over time.

Should our AGM decide to continue its affiliation with Cats NSW, it will be under its newly elected executive committee. As at 1st December Helena Sugar is President, Rebekah Darmody is Secretary and Susan Hudson its Treasurer, with Tony Hurry Snr VP and Debs Armishaw VP. This new committee is challenged with bringing new members to Cats NSW, to promote a fun and rewarding experience at its shows, and to promote responsible ownership of a cat, all whilst operating with visibility and friendliness. To our SCS members, please consider giving a **Cats NSW Show** a go as it is a place to share your Siamese experiences and to promote your breed.

2019 also found some of our members fall on ill health and suffer difficult times with loss of property through fire and rain. I wish each of you well and hope you can enjoy a speedy return to best health and former living conditions. And to those members who assisted with rescue or homing animals whilst others were in need, I offer my sincere thanks for a job well done.

Finally, I must again thank my fellow committee members for their work in 2019 and for the support they have given me as your SCS President. New opportunities and new challenges are something to look forward to in 2020 and I encourage and welcome each of your ideas and continued support.

To all our members, sales of our Siamese continue to be strong as customers return for repeat purchase and new ones arrive. Let us all continue to strive to promote the virtues and values of being owned by a Siamese, which is a paramount reason why your SCS committee is here working for you.

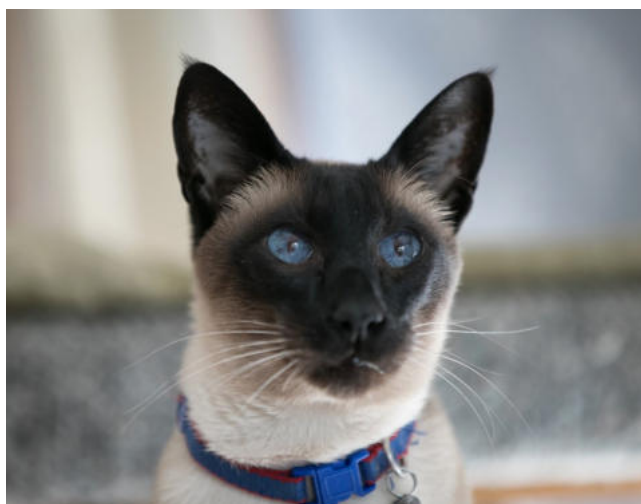

Taya came into our lives in 2003, when Chai, our Number Two Cat (son), was approaching sixteen years of age and we knew his time was coming to an end. We contacted his breeder, Rhondda Watson, of Sucheng Cattery, to thank her for the great happiness Chai had brought to our lives. Mrs Watson told us she was retiring from breeding and had just produced her last Sucheng litter. There were two boys and two girls. We immediately decided to purchase one of the kittens. Taya's time with us overlapped with Chai's by just three weeks. Mrs Watson remained very much in our consciousness. Taya might, for example, have sleep in his eye and we'd say, "Oh Taya! Mrs Watson would be horrified to see you with a mucky eye!" I phoned Mrs Watson the day before Taya passed and thanked her for the 16 years of great happiness with Taya and a total of 32 years of happiness with the two boys.

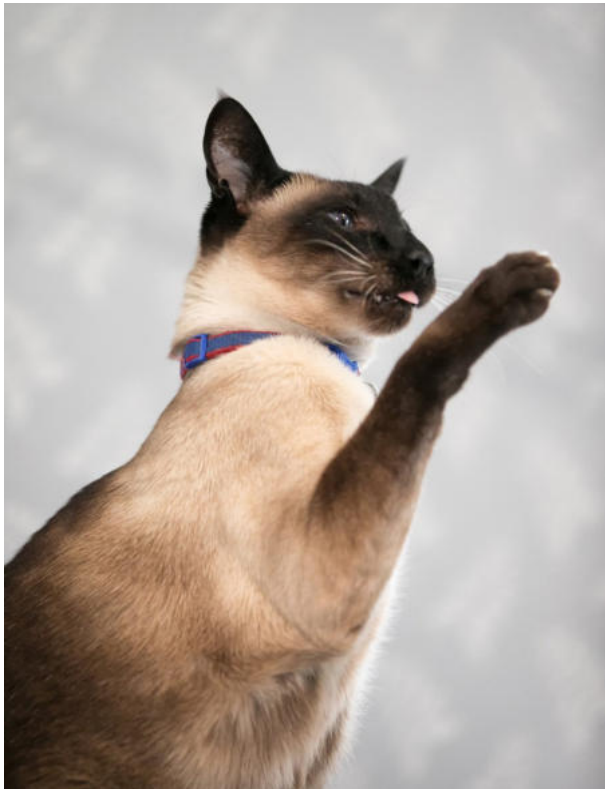


I'm practically Perfect (and handsome with it!)

When Taya visited the vet for his Little Operation and we returned to collect him, we asked Barbara behind the reception desk if he'd been a problem. Aunty Barbara replied, "Taya's been practically a little angel." Taya obviously heard that, because he reminded us almost every day. "YOW! I'm Practically a Little Angel, everybody! Aren't I?!" This was the basis of Taya's full title: 'Taya, The Practically Perfect'. After a time, Taya started adding, "And Handsome With It!" and that stuck, too. Taya has never been averse to compliments.

When Chai passed away, I was so sad at the loss of the best friend I'd ever had. I never expected to have such a good friend again. Chai had rusted himself on to me when I was ill and went everywhere with me, usually riding on my shoulder. Chai always slept all night in the crook of my arm with his head on my shoulder and, with the help of Bedtime Bikkies, I was able to convince Taya that it was good to be a Bedtime Buddy. There have been very few nights in the past sixteen years when Taya wasn't on my chest nose to nose with me. I'd rub his back and tell him how wonderful he was and he'd gaze into my eyes and say, "YOW! Yes, I am wonderful, and Handsome With It!" Even on his very last night, he lay on my chest and was my Bedtime Buddy. The way he would gaze into my eyes was so intense, as if he could read my thoughts behind them.

Taya always had a larger-than-life, swashbuckling personality. As a youngster, he'd bolt around the house and get up to so much mischief. I used to imagine him with a round, red clown's nose or

a pirate's eye patch! He used to adore playing with 'pidies' ('spiders' made of two pipe cleaners twisted together). He'd grab them and toss them in the air and then leap on them having so much fun. He was so adept at climbing and leaping and getting into unexpected places and loved pouncing on Josephine and Sammy, our two DSH rescue cats. "YOW! Gotcha a beauty Aunty Jo!"

We didn't realise how bonded to Sammy Taya was until, when Taya was seven years old, renal failure took Sammy from us. After the vet left and we'd cuddled Sammy's little body and grieved together, I laid Sammy to rest in the garden beside the cat pen, marking the spot with flowers and a cat figurine. That night, at around bedtime, Taya went out into the pen, sat down on the other side of the wire from Sammy's grave and yowled heartrendingly at the top of his very capable lungs. We wondered about that, especially when Taya made encore performances at the same time each night. We tried distracting him with games and treats but he'd promptly return to his late night yowling. We phoned

Mrs Watson for advice and she told us that Taya was grieving for Sammy just as much as we were. She advised getting a kitten, preferably a girl. Enter Millicent, our lovely seal point girl. I'm sure Taya loved Millicent. She certainly loved him. She would smoochie up to Taya and say, "Wrow! I love you, Taya!" Taya would look at Millicent and say, "YOW, Millicent! Love is a very strong word. I tolerate you."

Taya used to love jumping into our little china cabinet where he'd always sit carefully in the same corner never disturbing a thing, saying "YOW! I's an ornament!" When Millicent arrived in our household, she, being a Copy Cat, attempted the same thing when Taya did, sitting on a different shelf. The difference was that, as a youngster, Millicent took her little wrecking ball everywhere with her so we had to be quick to allow Taya to leap in and then close the door. He'd sit there in his corner happily being an

ornament until we again opened the door, at which he'd leap lightly to the floor and go about his business.

Taya accompanied us on most of the holidays we've been on in the past decade and a half. He was a wonderful traveller. He'd sit in his carrier and gaze out

the window until the scenery obviously became a bit same-ish to him whereupon he'd curl up and go to sleep. When Millicent joined our family, she also began going on our holidays, but unlike Taya, Millicent was more inclined to ask in her squeaky soprano, "Wrow! Are we there yet?"

Taya was always an incredibly sociable boy and loved to meet people. When people arrived, he'd always be there with us to greet them. Our neighbour told us that she came to our front door one day to find the screen door locked and the wooden door open. She rang the doorbell and knocked but received no response. We were enjoying time in the back garden. Liz called to us and Taya came to the front door, looked up at her and gave a loud, baritone YOW!

Liz said that Taya then walked from the front door to the back door where he gave another loud YOW! or two. After a moment, he

came back to the front door, looked up at Liz and said, "YOW!" Liz told us later, 'It was as if he was saying, "Well, I tried."'

Taya has been central to my life for a quarter of my time on the planet. We have sat together in my chair and out in the sunshine. We've enjoyed many long chats. We've walked

garden which is very secluded and secure and we've had occasional walks, using Taya's harness and lead, around the front garden which is well screened from the street. In all that time, we've been Best Buddies and now, all too soon, it's over. I'll live every day from now on with a Taya shaped hole in my life but also with such precious memories and a never-fading warm glow of love.

We will be forever grateful that Taya graced our lives and contributed so much love, laughter and joy. He's been the richest blessing. I have often observed to Taya, "How sad it is, Boy, for all those poor people who don't have a Taya in their lives! There is only one You, and we've been so blessed to have you all to ourselves." Taya would always

reply: "YOW! That's sad for them, but they can make their own arrangements, Grahame.

I HAVE ALWAYS LOVED SIAMESE CATS...

Sandra Sweetman, per Roberta C.

Roberta C. is one of our latest new members, but has always had a love of Siamese Cats dating back 50 years ago when her husband surprised her and just turned up one day with a pure Seal Point Siamese kitten in his arms. Roberta took one look at the kitten and immediately fell in love with the breed.

Roberta said “it was their loving temperament and intelligence that won me over. It was one of the most beautiful cats I had ever seen. She was so much more than the regular ‘moggy’ cat, one which had been in the family for many years. With my increasing knowledge of the Siamese breed I became aware of their ability to attach to one’s personally and be a dedicated companion, overcoming the ‘moggy’s’ independent spirit.”

She explained, “they ingratiate themselves and become part of your active family and lifestyle. We called the kitten ‘Isolde’. She even came away with us at weekends and on holidays, in fact everywhere we went, Isolde went also”.

Roberta became a Siamese Cat Breeder in the first decade of this century under the prefix ‘*Golconda*’, which Roberta explained was an actual place in India where gold was found. It is now a ruined city lying 8 kms west of Hyderabad in southern India.

Roberta bred Siamese cats for only a couple of years because, she explained, “I became too attached to the kittens I bred. I couldn’t let them go without anxiety and a fear for their future wellbeing. It was still a wonderful experience

breeding this regal, beautiful and friendly cat. I liked the idea of producing first class animals and I thought it was a good idea but I found it very difficult to part with them so this was why I stopped breeding, but I have always owned pure Siamese since then, buying only from reputable breeders.”

She remains thankful to Valda McDermott who mentored her at the time and gave her guidance, advice and encouragement. Valda, Roberta said, “encouraged me, and I am always grateful to her even though my career as a registered Cat Breeder was very short. Francine Skane (Mirra) together with Valda supported me over those few years with my breeding programme.”

Roberta continued, "I have always owned pure Seal Point Siamese. One of the cats that I now have is Clementine, who came from the Hunter Valley and is now 12 years old. Clementine's litter mate Tobias recently passed away so I replaced Tobias with one of Valda McDermott's kittens who I called Lady MacBeth or "Mackie". I also recently bought another kitten from Siamese Breeder Sandra Sweetman named "Basil" (Shiloh Mai'u Basil by USA Imported Stud Kaluamoa Ocean Eyes, a stud cat owned by Sharryn Hilton). I named him after my late Uncle/ Godfather, Basil Longman of Bindi Bindi, WA, and after whom Sandra registered him. When I mentioned that I was going to get another Siamese kitten, Basil, some of my friends said that

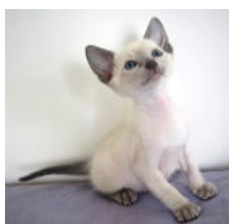
