PRA is primarily found in Abyssinians & Persians, and research is continuing as to its presence in Siamese. With DNA testing available for PRA, responsible Siamese breeders are testing their kittens from 6 weeks of age prior to rehoming as they carry a duty of care to advise new owners of the results of testing.

Keeping your pet Siamese Happy: or is it *Keeping you happy?*

Well, you have a new purebred Siamese kitten, for the first time, yes? You have brought the baby home, and now the fun starts!

My last kitten, Pepe, headed beneath the lounge initially, quite terrified at his new surroundings. That night he slept curled up beneath my bedclothes, warm as toast, and from then on we were inseparable.

They work us out quickly, you know! But because Siamese have been bred to really need contact with their special human(s) on a regular basis, if that is not forthcoming, they will let you know....and boy, their other attribute is their powerful voice, which makes their presence felt whenever they deem necessary. So it is wise to be aware of what you are in for, before your purchase.

While their vocal nature might be a downside for some owners not used to this, the upside is they use it to communicate their feelings to you far better than many other cats. And you soon get used to the many different 'meow' sounds they make when talking to you. They have a great variety of tones and volume levels, and you will find you will respond in a way you may otherwise not have expected to.

In order to keep your kitten and the human(s) who also live in the household happy, perhaps a few thoughts on 'bringing up a happy baby' may be worthwhile.

Food and Drink

While your kitten will have been used to a certain diet at the breeder's place, it is worthwhile aiming to encourage your kitten early in life to

eat at least a portion of raw, or cooked meat, such as chicken, beef or boneless fish pieces, and uncooked chicken necks or wings (never cooked as the bones splinter). This will give your cat the best chance of having healthy teeth and gums in adulthood. Although proprietary cat foods (wet) are supposed to contain balanced nutrients, they are too soft and mushy to encourage much chewing, and this is what is needed to preserve gum health.

Also, while the many varieties of cat biscuits can encourage chewing to some extent, the size of the biscuits over the years is continually shrinking, including the originally larger "Oral Care" ones. Hence the cat can gobble them, without always chewing, more easily. From my experience over a lifetime of Siamese cats in my home, gum problems and tartar will often occur if they don't eat chewable meat portions regularly. And that can mean teeth cleaning at your vet's and a costly anaesthetic. Also watch the quantity and avoid

over feeding, as the weight may soon pile on as you cat grows older, and other health issues may arise.

Always provide fresh water for your cat daily. They need it just like we do. And there are some brands of cat milk in supermarkets that they love a little of too. I mix some with a little water and only give a very shallow saucer of it once a day or every second day. Avoid cow's milk, which will result in diarrhoea in most Siamese.

Playtime

If you want a happy cat, you won't be able to escape playing with your kitten, and even into cathood. They value their owner by the amount of funtime provided, even more than good food, and the value of quality playtime cannot be underestimated. Especially cats living indoors, where it is up to you much of the time to provide suitable toys and other stimulation. There are many toys on the market, some of which are battery operated and move by remote control, all of which are expensive. Simple toys such as crushed up newspaper balls on a string, ping pong balls, a spare toilet roll, cardboard boxes they can hide in and pounce at you from, feathers

on a string, etc. often provide as good, or better, stimulation. As long as you are involved with them and interacting with them, they are happy.

The value of a tall cat scratching post or 'tree' (covered with carpet or similar) with a complex of shelves at different heights, short tunnels and hiding places cannot be underestimated. Cats love them. They are expensive, but if you can't make one, they are a worthy investment. Siamese are no different from other cats in that they love to jump, and this will greatly help save your furniture! Then if you play with them on there and dangle toys etc. for them to swipe at, this is an added bonus.

A long, inexpensive collapsible tunnel is another good investment (I found one recently at Ikea). Cats love them and chasing through them after toys dangled at one end, or thrown into them is always fun. If you have two or more cats, they will have a great time playing chasings through the tunnel, and love nothing more than ambushing one another from outside or inside.

And no doubt you will soon find out that Siamese love to retrieve special toys thrown for them, although unlike dogs, which want you to throw that stick or ball 150+ times (!), your Siamese cat is much more reasonable, persisting with most games only for short periods! An old pair of socks bundled together or soft small toy can be great items for retrieving games. They don't usually respond to retrieving balls, I have found, as they can't (and don't like to) enclose their mouth around them as easily and readily as a dog.

Sleeptime

Cats sleep many hours a day, and a warm, comfortable bed is very important during the day, especially if it can be placed near a sunny window during winter. Doughnut beds or warm hutch-type beds, with an offcut of lambswool skin or other warm material will be good. But if you only have one cat, expect to have your lap or other

parts of your body imposed upon often in colder weather. My two snuggle up together happily in their bed during the day, which frees me up for other tasks. At night, you and your bed will be their target, so you will most likely find you will need to adjust to a warm body or bodies as hot water bottle replacements! There is nowhere they would rather be for a long sleep, so be prepared.

Toilet

Toilet trays need to be regularly changed and litter replenished. I find the Ozpet tray system very good, because the pellets last well with no smell. Droppings can be removed as needed, and as the pellets break down, the bottom tray can be emptied into the compost heap. Some other products are not as recyclable, so look into it carefully. If your cat/kitten had been used to one type of litter and you need to train it to accept another, gradually replace part of the old litter with the new rather than changing everything suddenly. That way the smell of the initial litter will permeate the new and the cat will accept it quite easily.

House Rules?

You need to train your Siamese not to do things like jump up on the kitchen bench and steal food, or other unwanted behaviour. They are agile, wilful and determined, and love getting

up on and in cupboards or furniture, so if you start training early, they learn and will respond, as long as you are consistent and fair (and can catch them in the act. A sharp reprimand like “no” while pointing an upright finger at him/her, when the wrong behaviour is happening, will eventually bring results, but you need to mean NO when you say it and don’t give in to them. Clapping your hands loudly works well as a deterrent, or hitting a piece of rolled-up newspaper against your hand. In extreme cases, a quick spray from a bottle of water directed towards the offender will work miracles! But there should never be a reason to strike the cat, apart from perhaps a finger tapped onto his nose to get him to back off what he’s doing.

Scratching furniture can be tricky, but if you catch the cat at it early, there are various ways of winning that battle too (perhaps one for the spray bottle!). Cats hate citrus smell, so spraying furniture corners with that can help to discourage this behaviour too.

Your company

Never underestimate the strong need Siamese have for closeness with their owner. It is vital to keep your cat(s) happy. You will need to be sensitive to their needs, but also train them to be a bit more independent for times when this is needed. Siamese personalities vary from those who want to follow you everywhere and interrupt you for a cuddle (even while you are visiting the toilet!), to those who can be a bit more stand-offish to a degree, at times. Overall, they need to know where you are and what you are doing, and are most relaxed if you are somewhere near them when they sleep. My Marli (age 6) comes and gets me every morning and leads me into the room where she sleeps with brother Pepe, jumps up on the swivel chair where she loves to be swivelled around, and then gets her special pat and groom after I lift her across to their bed. This

routine is ingrained and she makes a fuss until it happens the ways she wants!

Pepe (now age 7), on the other hand is nearly always wherever I am, ready for a pat or cuddle. I need to ignore him a little at times when I’m busy, if he gets too demanding, and he soon gives up trying to get a ‘pick-up’. He still retrieves and carries his little soft toy everywhere, tossing it for himself to play with or me to throw for him. He even sits with it out on the grass, then carries it back inside when he goes. I have installed electric wire around the top of my fence years ago before I got the cats, which worked wonders in stopping Pepe deciding to jump the fence (and other cats visiting), and Marli never tried. But they only go outside for short periods, mainly if I go out during the day, and are never allowed out at night.

Feline Company

When you have to leave home for a holiday, or even to do shopping etc., having more than one Siamese will be of great assistance, because then they have each other for company if no one can be there. It is lovely to watch two cats playing together, or cuddling and cleaning each other (even right inside their ears!), before settling down to snuggle together for a nap. But be aware, this feline harmony is easiest to achieve if both are young when they are introduced, or perhaps are two kittens from the same litter when

you buy them. If you get two together at the same time they will bond with each other and you, if you get one on its own first, it will bond strongly with you, and if you introduce another one to your first one some time later, (following procedures your breeder will explain as to how to introduce them slowly and carefully at first), the new cat/kitten will bond more with the first cat, but also with you, although perhaps to a slightly lesser degree or in a different way.

A few final tips

LOVE your Siamese! And you will be rewarded forever with barrel loads of affection, so don't buy a Siamese if you don't want to be loved!

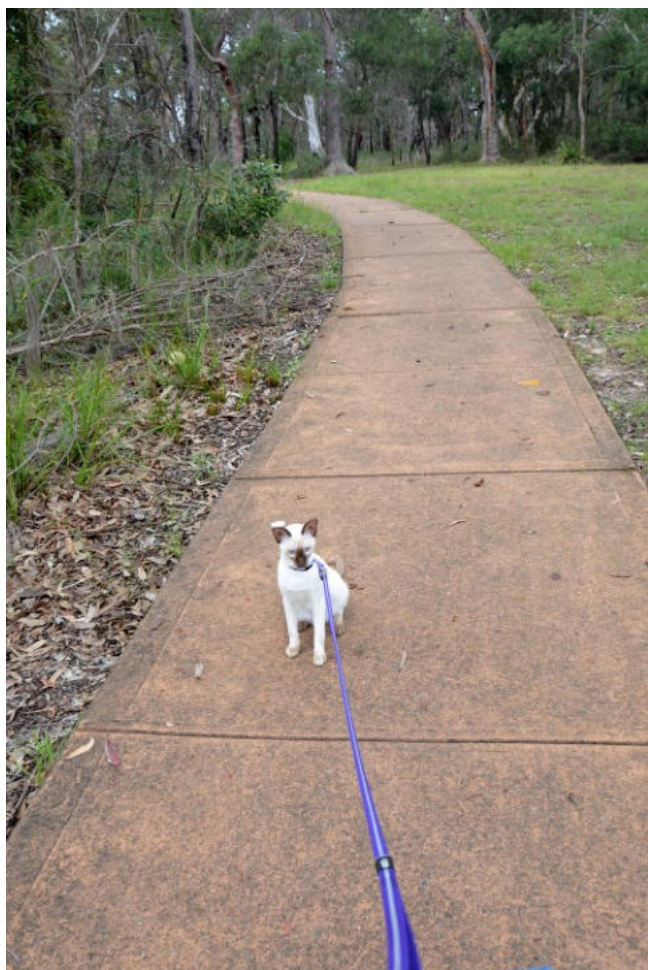
ROUTINE. Cats are creatures of habit and love their daily routine to be pretty much the

same. So keep food and play times to about the same time, and they will look after sleep time!

TRAINING. If you want them to train to a lead, or perhaps other tasks, start while they are young and be patient. It can take about a week of daily practice sessions (short ones) for lead training, perhaps a bit longer.

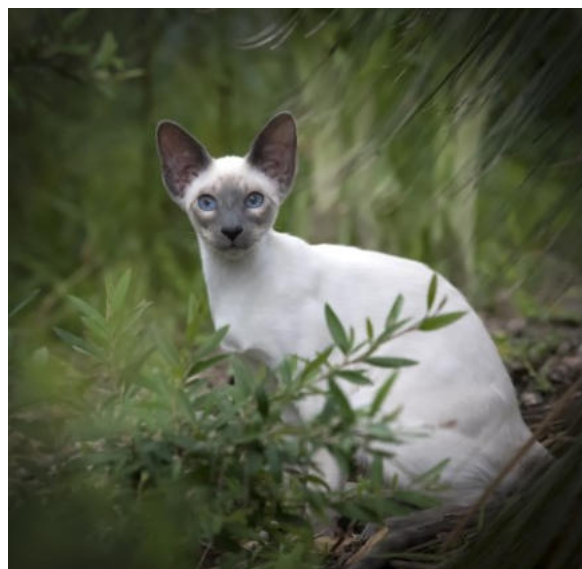
TRAVEL. It is worthwhile getting them used to car travel (always in a cat carrier), so be patient and start with frequent short trips in a quiet street, that don't include going to the vet!

SCS Banner Photo Competition Reminder

ELIGIBILITY:

The SCS Banner Photographic Competition is open to all full members of the Siamese Cat Society NSW who own a 'purebred' Siamese Cat. Any photograph entered must be of a 'living' cat or kitten not one that has passed away. The cat/kitten must be **owned by the Entrant** and must be a '**pure' one breed Siamese**. NB: If a 'non-member' wishes to enter the Competition, they need to first become a full member of the Siamese Cat Society of NSW (SCS) and send in a copy of the cat's pedigree prior to entry.

Only 1 x photograph entry per person in each category is allowed. One person can enter up to four photographs but the limit is **one entry per each colour category**:

- Seal point Siamese
- Blue point Siamese
- Chocolate point Siamese
- Lilac point Siamese

The four winning cats and/or kittens photos will be featured on the new SCS club exhibition banner and all entries may be featured in future editions of Felis (*at the Editors discretion*).

SPONSORSHIP and PRIZES:

The sponsors of the show are Advance and Rosettes & Ribbons. Each winner of the above four categories will each be presented with a 3 kgs bag of Advance Multi cat dry cat biscuits and a rosette.

NB: a winner and owner of a cat/kitten can win only one of the categories so that each of these individual sessions feature four different owners/breeders. Once an owner/breeder's cat/kitten has been chosen for that category then they will be excluded from winning in another of the four categories. Collection of the prizes can be arranged through a SCS Committee member or at a Sydney Cat Show.

AGREEMENT TO RULES:

By entering this SCS Banner Photographic Competition the entrant agrees to abide by these SCS Official Rules and decisions.

The entrant agrees to participate based on eligibility requirements explained in these Official Rules. The entrant agrees to accept the decisions of the SCS Committee as final and binding. If entry rules are not complied with, the SCS reserves the right to disqualify an entry.

The Contest will be judged by a panel of members and breeders on the SCS Committee on 11th September 2021 and winners announced by email notification, and also in the December issue of Felis magazine where their photos will be displayed.

ENTRY PERIOD

This Contest begins on 10th May 2021 and will end on 16th July, at 5:30pm, Australian Eastern Time. Entries outside this time period will be deemed ineligible to enter.

HOW TO ENTER

Eligible entrants can enter the SCS Banner Photographic Competition by submitting an email entry and a separate photograph attachment of the cat/kitten.

If the image is too large to be sent by email, please notify Marion Anstis: frogpole@tpg.com.au (so that a web transfer link can be provided).

NB: The image will need the following specifications:

- a large size and of high quality resolution in full colour
- be from the original size straight out of the camera
- be unedited and not cropped
- be in focus (sharp), especially with the cat/kitten's face clear.

If a photograph is selected as one of the final winners, any editing, cropping or resizing required will be completed by the Designer of the Banner. If you use a mobile phone, then the image needs to be set at the highest resolution/largest size possible.

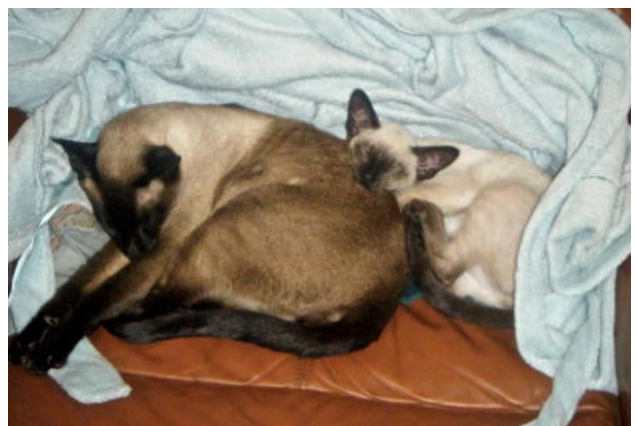

Our Siamese boy, Taya, the Practically Perfect (and Handsome With It), grieved terribly for Sammy, sitting by the grave yowling at bedtime each night. Rhondda Watson, Taya's breeder at Sucheng Cattery, suggested we bring home a little girl kitten for company for him, hence our visit with Christine.

Millicent was a hit with us all from the first day. She was, and remains, so sweet and was readily accepted by Taya, with whom she quickly bonded. They remained firm friends for the rest of Taya's life. They enjoyed supervised garden time with us, games in the house and in their

pen and lots of cuddles together. Taya had always accompanied us on our holidays and Millicent joined in. At first, she was inclined to ask us, "Are we there yet?" and we'd need to break our journey to give her a rest, but she quickly adapted and thoroughly enjoyed our holidays.

Millicent was an adventurous little soul. One of our biggest trees in the garden had to have a sheet of plastic roofing wrapped around its trunk to prevent her climbing too high during Garden Time. Taya loved our little china cabinet and, whenever the door was opened, he'd leap in lightly and sit among the plates, porcelain dolls and ornaments without disturbing a thing. Not so, his little sister! We had to be vigilant to allow Taya his time as a precious ornament but to prevent Millicent from joining him, as she tended to take her little silver wrecking ball with her. Her playfulness and impish mischief led to her ironic title, 'the Innocent', as did the episode when she escaped from our home. We searched frantically for our little girl until I found her and returned her to Lyn who promptly burst into tears of relief. It was the longest half hour of our lives.

When we moved to our present home at Wentworth Falls in the Blue Mountains, Taya and Millicent were allowed supervised Garden Time



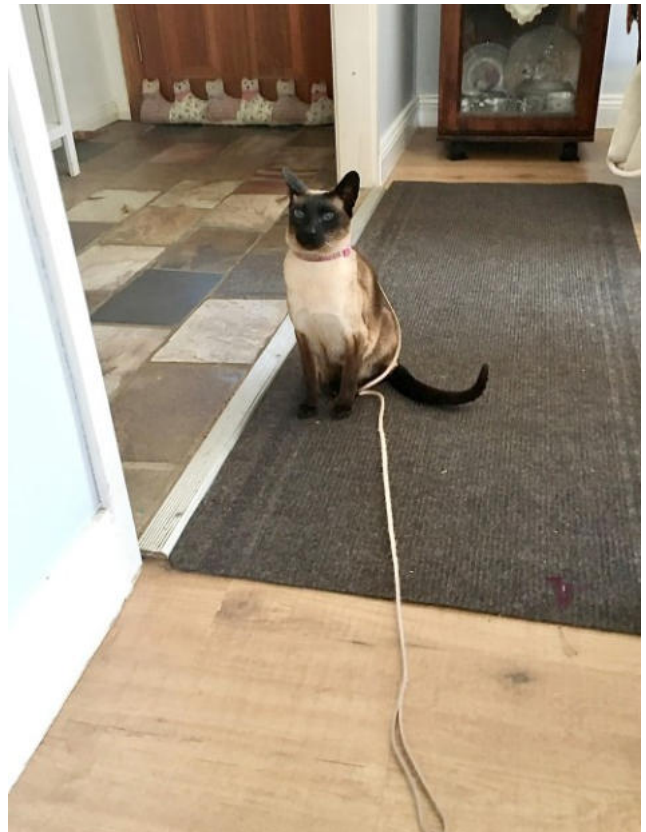

wearing their harnesses and leads, and we found that the decorative garden was quite secure. We decided that the other parts of the garden would be out of bounds to prevent escapes. By the end of Taya's life, Millicent (now aged 9) was showing signs of difficulty jumping onto our bed and I lowered the frame for her. We thought her tree and fence climbing days were over.

Millicent, Lyn and I did our best to adapt to Taya's passing in September, 2019, and soon we introduced Charlotte and Solomon, our lovely next generation, from Sharon Black's Tamjana Cattery.

In late April this year, while working in the fenced vegetable garden, I allowed Millicent to keep me company and I took my eye off the ball momentarily. Millicent wandered through the culinary mint growing along the back fence. I found her minutes later, in the yard behind ours! The little minx had used a wooden pallet, which was waiting to be broken up for firewood, as a ladder and had scaled the fence! A week later, Millicent scaled a trellis and tried to go over the side fence. It was clear that she could again hear the call of the wild.

As a compromise, I started taking Millicent for walks on her harness and lead again. Our street, very near the national park, is very quiet and Milly walks really well with me, pausing occasionally to sniff a plant, to roll on some concrete or to gaze longingly down a path or driveway. She has



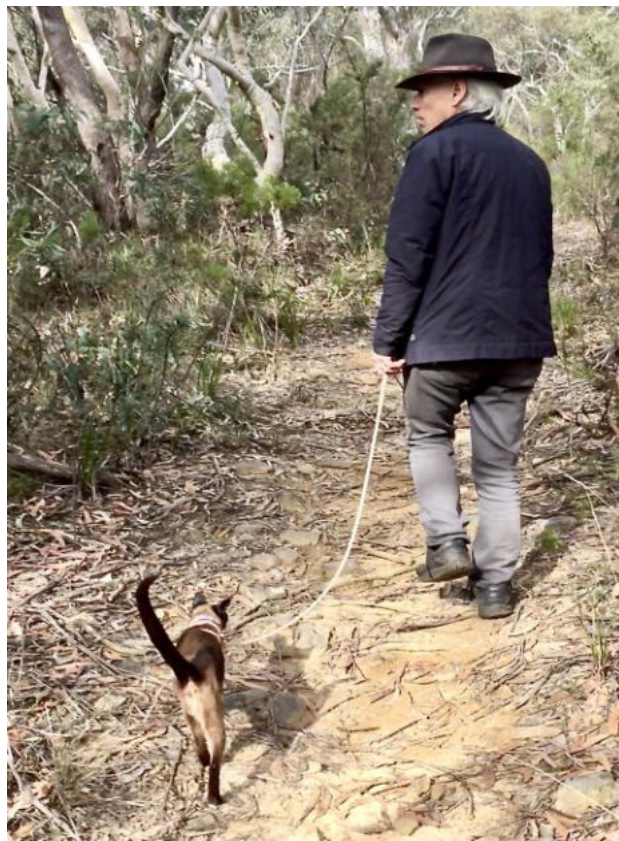

I'll leave you with a few sample entries from "Millicent's Diary":

June 12, 2021

Dear Diary. Daddy and I missed having our walk the other day because it was snowing, so today I made sure we'd go out for a stroll. I enjoy sitting on Daddy's lap having a swing under the redwood trees down at the end of the road. (Millicent, the Innocent)

June 20, 2021

July 5, 2021

Dear Diary. Today's walk was very enjoyable. It was pretty cold outside but sunny and I 'Wrowed' loudly when we went out. Solomon wanted to come but Daddy told him there was a limit of only ONE cat per walk and since I'M the Senior Cat, that's ME! We had a good long walk around Aunt Gab's garden with plenty of interesting sniffs. We had a go on Aunt Gab's rocking chair

in the sunshine and I liked that. We walked down the road and had a swing on the swings hanging from the old redwood tree. I like sitting on Daddy's lap on the swing. After our swing, we walked along two bush tracks, where there were interesting sniffs and lots of birds. Now it's time for a sleep on Mummy's lap. The End. (Millicent, the Innocent [and Magnificent, too])

July 6, 2021

Dear Diary. Today, Daddy tricked me. We set off along what looked like a new track. As I walked along, sniffing the Sniffs and looking for birds, I started to feel a bit Oogy. I stopped and had a think and looked over my shoulder at where we'd come from.
