Reminders to all Members and Breeders

In accordance with sections 9 (2) and 10 of the Companion Animal Act, a companion animal is required to be registered:

- (a) from the time the animal is 12 weeks old *or*
- (b) when the animal is first sold (even if it is less than 12 weeks old).

Every kitten and cat must have a microchip at the time of application for registration.

Please note: the **Cats NSW Registrar's postal address** has changed. Members should also be aware that the details on the reverse side of any pedigrees issued prior to February 2025 may have the old postal address on them.

The new postal address for the Cats NSW Registrar for all cat/kitten registrations, title updates etc. is: **Cats NSW Registrar, PO Box 5033, South Tamworth, NSW 2340**
all changes for pedigrees, title updates etc. need to be mailed there.

Breeders note: all verifiable DNA results should be forwarded to Cats NSW Registrar for inclusion with updated Certificate of Registration.

President's Annual Report

2024 continued to provide its challenges to most of our Siamese breeders with rising costs and lessening demand. We must stay united in asking our fair and reasonable prices and validating to our enquiries that they are purchasing a "pure" Siamese, compliant with all health and statutory requirements.

In June 2024 we were provided with a terrific opportunity by way of the Australian Cat Federation's National Cat Show to not only promote our Siamese but to network with other breeders and enthusiasts of cats. Held at the Hawkesbury Showground, it drew not only 380 exhibits over the two days but also a good attendance by the general public. Success of our "pure" Siamese was scattered throughout the Top 15 of each of the Group 2 six rings of judging. Congratulations to Astraxalotte (The Gallagher Family), Shiloh (Sandra and Ross Sweetman), Siampearl (Vanessa Garofano) and Joanne Nash for their successes.

The Sydney Royal Easter Cat Show once again provided a huge opportunity to promote our breed and my thanks to Vanessa Garofano, Marion Anstis and Amanda Ramsey for representing the Society and even taking home the most informative breed display prize!!

Our other significant event in 2024 was the Siamese Speciality ring held as part of the Cats NSW show 15th September at Panthers North Richmond. Judge Bronwyn Townshend-Main (NZCF) was impressed and amazed with the standard of exhibits presented to her. Congratulations to **Kalinya YR Am, a female cat, lilac point owned by Vanessa Garofano and bred by Tony and Bev Hurry for winning the prestigious Joyce Selby award for Best "pure, one breed" Siamese exhibit. The other award I would like to mention is the "In Memory of the Late Lesley Bourke" \$200.00 cash award for the "pure" Siamese exhibit with the Best Personality, this year won by ACF Ruby AOE Emerald DGC CCCA Gd Ch Astraxalotte Akoni Gem, a blue point male cat owned by Sandra and Ross Sweetman and bred by The Galagher Family. Other results have been published in *Felis and a very well done to each of the winners.***

We must continue to promote our breed and this was done very well during 2024 by exhibiting at Cats NSW, NSWCFA, Sydney Royal and ACF National Cat shows. Outstanding Cat of the Year results by Shiloh (Sandra and Ross Sweetman) with Cats NSW and Astraxalotte (The Gallagher Family) with NSWCFA saw a great number of their exhibits achieve placings demonstrating that "pure" Siamese can compete successfully. Their efforts were supported by our member exhibitors Sharon Black (Tamjana), Vanessa Garofano (Siampearl), Joanne Nash (Sharelia), Stephen Bridgland, Tony and Bev Hurry (Kalinya).

Our Felis publication continues to provide articles of interest, facts and results, and advertisements so my big thank you to its editor Marion Anstis for dedicating the hours of her time to provide such a wonderful result. It seems that even our fellow breeders in USA are a little envious of Felis!!

Thanks to our Secretary Sharon Black who supported me and continued with not only our secretarial duties but also as our representative to Cats NSW. The role of representative was quite an arduous one in 2024 due to a few matters of discipline that confronted its committee, as well as running a National Show.

Our newbie Kitten Registrar Vanessa Garofano in accepting this role has found communications with our breeders at times frustrating given what appears to be resistance or reluctance to provide her the information that can best assist her with enquiries for our kittens, both verbally and via our website. MEMBERS PLEASE NOTE: As at 1st July 2023 you must have a Service NSW account to access NSW Pet Registry



Registration and permit fees

All pet cats and dogs in NSW must be registered on the NSW Pet Registry either by 12 weeks of age or immediately upon transfer (whichever happens first).

Until payment is made, your pet is not registered and you may be liable for fines, including a fixed penalty notice of \$330. A late payment fee will also be applied if you do not pay registration when required.

You only need to pay the registration fee once, when you first take ownership of a pet. It covers the cat or dog for its lifetime in NSW, even if ownership changes.

Breeders must register puppies and kittens in their own name and pay the once-only registration fee if they are still in their care at 12 weeks of age.

Vale, Diana Arnold

A few of us recently commented on Facebook that we had lost track of **Di Arnold**, AB judge for many years and breeder of spectacular Siamese. In fact, almost any top Australian Siamese of the last few decades of the 20th century owed much of their success to Di's "Benwell" cats. She was breeding in the early 1960's, and was one of those who clubbed together to form FCCV. This morning, I awoke to a message of explanation from a friend of hers. I am much saddened to report that apparently Di passed away in the middle of last year after a series of hospital and nursing home "stretches" following a fall.

She was referred to (most affectionately!) as "Lady Di" long before the UK had its own. She had a natural elegance and style, and the ladylike demeanour was usually maintained except in the company of close friends. Model, equestrienne, bonsai enthusiast and thoughtful breeder of exceptional and generally, exceptionally long-lived Siamese, I admired her a great deal.



Feline Health Conference... a Reminder

This year's Feline health Seminar will be held on **Sunday 9 November 2025** at Wests, Ashfield, so please put this date in your diary **and let others know**. We have booked the venue and identified the five topic areas of particular interest to SSF Members and other cat lovers. We will now try and identify and/or confirm suitable speakers/presenters for each area of interest to ensure that we have a varied and informative program. Eva will update us on progress in a few weeks.

1. *Ophthalmic issues in cats*

- chronic eye discharge, corneal ulcers;
- cataracts and eye infections in older cats (treatment options); and
- Progressive Retinal Atrophy (PRA)

2. *Diseases affecting cats (Professor Jacqui Norris)*

- Feline Infectious Peritonitis (treatment update);
- Avian flu (H5 strain) – update on risk of transmission to cats and other species including hu mans
- Amyloidosis.

3. *Reproduction and Breeding (Dr Jasmin Hyatt)*

- rodent ulcers after pregnancy;
- failure to conceive (possible causes);
- Management of stud cats including mating issues; and
- Feline contraception (what's new?).

4. *Behavioural issues*

- cat stress issues in multi-cat households and how to best manage;
- displaced aggression to a cat buddy following a visit to the vet or other adverse incident;
- dementia in cats (diagnosis and management);
- inappropriate soiling by desexed cats and how to best manage ; and
- socialising a 'scaredy cat'.

5. *Adverse reactions from vaccines and other medications (Dr Cicilia Muller)*

- identifying an adverse reaction to a medication and/or vaccine;
- which vaccines are known to have a higher rate of adverse reactions ?
- What medications are not well tolerated by cats.

Megacolon: An Important Health Issue that can affect our Siamese

Marli is my very special, sweet-natured Blue Point purebred Siamese cat (pictured above), and has been with me since she was a kitten in 2015. She is desexed and aged 9.

For the past few years, she has been struggling trying to pass her stools, and although she has eventually done so, I had noticed they were always hard, dry, round, black balls. And she was often likely to vomit up her breakfast. Quite often when she was in trouble, she would come into the lounge room or other rooms (all carpeted!) rather than using her tray, and try to strain in a corner, mostly without success. This was her way of letting me know she was in trouble. So off we went to the vet.

The advice I first got from one vet was to try using Benefiber, which is sold as a fibre supplement in supermarkets for human consumption. Dosage he recommended was about 1/3 teaspoon twice a day. I tried using it for a few weeks, putting it in her wet food, but she still had trouble, and I found the stools were actually increasing in size, still black and dry, and no softer.

One day in early February this year, she became very depressed and just stayed still resting quietly, showing no interest in food or water. The next day I took her to another vet (this time at a veterinary hospital) where she saw a vet who gave her an enema, blood tests (to check kidney function, which was normal) and prescribed Actilax (a laxative liquid, again available for humans) at a dosage of 2ml twice daily.

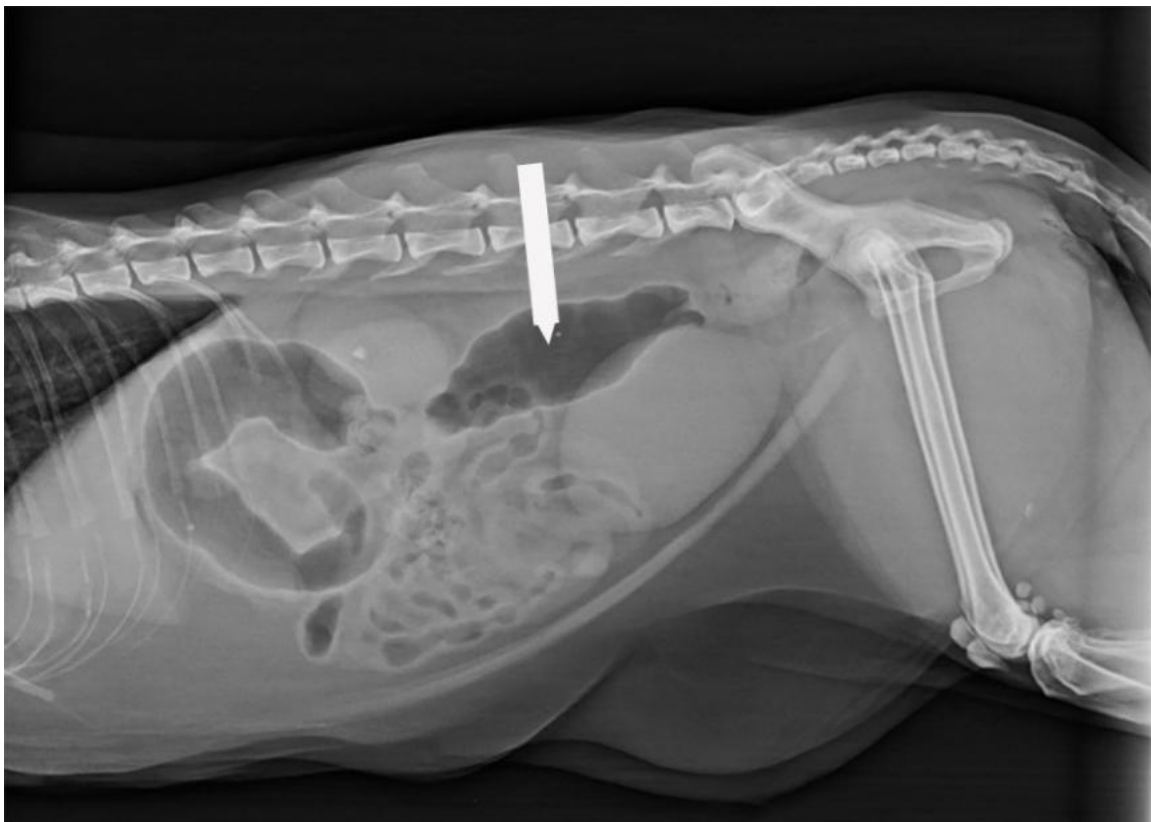
I followed her advice but again there was not much improvement, and in a few weeks she had an-

other day of going off food and drink and became very listless and unresponsive.

Vet visit no. 3. This time a different vet at the hospital saw her and was concerned she may have inflammatory bowel disease, which was extremely difficult to treat. She said to continue on with 2ml Actilax but she was to also have some particular Science Diet biscuits (can't remember which!). Things didn't improve in the next few days so I took her to see the leading vet at this hospital and he said he thought she might have a condition known as **Megacolon** and she needed to have an enema, then an Xray to determine this. The Xray confirmed his diagnosis, and while she was under anaesthetic, he had to use long forceps to remove some remaining faecal matter that had not passed despite the prior use of the enema.

So what is Megacolon?

Megacolon in cats is a condition characterized by an abnormal dilation of the colon, leading to difficulty in passing stool. This can result in severe constipation, discomfort, and a potential buildup of faecal matter. It may be caused by various factors, including prolonged constipation, muscle dysfunction of the colon, or underlying health issues. It tends to present more in older cats. Here is the Xray of Marli showing her expanded colon:



The white pointer indicates the expanded colon area where digested food gets stuck and dries out

Symptoms of megacolon in cats may include (and Marli had these!):

- Straining to defecate
- Lethargy
- Abdominal pain or distension

- Loss of appetite
- Vomiting
- Hard, dry stools

As the vet pointed out, it can be a difficult condition to manage and typically involves dietary changes, hydration, and sometimes medications or manual removal of faeces. In severe cases, surgical intervention may be necessary. But as he also said, the only surgery they can do is removal of the whole colon, following which the small intestine has to take over the load, and this can result in diarrhoea. So it then becomes a question of quality of life for the poor cat.

The Good news....

The good news I can report so far, is that after the first two days of the new treatment regime she was on, Marli produced a beautiful, brown (not black), more elongate than round, soft stool!! Hurray! Since then she has not struggled very much at all and I have checked her efforts most days for the first few weeks. But she is eating and drinking well, vomiting much less often and is much more relaxed in herself. The 4ml Actilax is just added to her wet food twice daily and then she also has some of her special biscuits. So we keep our fingers (and claws) crossed for the future!

The moral of this story?

It is very important for cat owners to consult a veterinarian if they suspect their cat has any similar symptoms to those listed above, as early diagnosis and treatment can help prevent further complications.

The “How to” of our Cat World

1. How to PURCHASE A KITTEN/CAT

- ◆ Research then decide on the breed that is best suited to your home.
- ◆ Decide on **Pet Only** (not to show) or a quality to **Show &/or Breed**
- ◆ Find a reputable, registered breeder of your chosen breed –

- ◆ Commit to purchase a kitten or cat registered with one of the above organisations.
- ◆ At time of receiving kitten or cat ensure you receive or are to be forwarded:
 - ⇒ Certificate of Registration with kitten or cat detailing you as the owner and that kitten or cat is able to be shown
 - ⇒ Evidence that kitten or cat has been vaccinated
 - ⇒ Evidence (vet certificate) that kitten/cat has been desexed (if not for breeding)
 - ⇒ Proof of lifetime registration with NSW Pet Registry (NSW only)
 - ⇒ Verifiable proof of DNA tests taken for heritable genetic diseases

2. How to RESEARCH a BREED FOR YOU

- ◆ Google and search the internet making sure that you only communicate with a breeder from a registered cat association
- ◆ Google and search the internet for a kitten or cat from a rescue or adoption organisation in your area i.e. RSPCA, Animal Welfare League, PetRescue
- ◆ Understand the health attributes or lack thereof of your breeds of interest
- ◆ Visit a cat show or exhibition

3. How to VISIT A CAT SHOW

- ◆ Google the internet by searching for cats shows in your area. Recognised associations each have a website with a Show Calendar detailing when, where and times where you can view many different breeds and talk with breeders and cat enthusiasts to assist with your research.
- ◆ You may even find a breeder with an older cat to rehome which may better suit you

4. How to JOIN A CAT ASSOCIATION

If you are intending to become a registered breeder or to enter a cat show with your kitten or cat you must become a member of a reputable, recognised cat association in your State. To assist, **ACF**, **CCCA**, **ANCATS** and **Cats Australia** websites will detail associations/member bodies/contact persons in your State. You will then be required to complete:

- ⇒ Application for Membership
- ⇒ Application for Breeders Prefix (only if intending to breed), noting that some applications may include a details questionnaire to be completed as part of the application.

In some instances, applications may take weeks to process, so please be patient as processing is done via volunteers who give freely of their time.

5. How to TRANSFER MEMBERSHIP FROM ANOTHER ASSOCIATION

- ◆ You cannot transfer membership. You must apply with the new chosen association then show evidence that you have resigned from previous association.
- ◆ You are not permitted to be a full member of more than one association. You are though, in most cases, permitted to be an associate member of more than one association.

6. How to TRANSFER BREEDERS PREFIX FROM ANOTHER ASSOCIATION

- ◆ Complete an Application for Transfer of Breeders Prefix Form which is available by either downloading from your chosen registering bodies website or by contacting its Secretary or President (details on website).
- ◆ Application can often include completing a multi-page questionnaire
- ◆ In support of your application, you will be required to supply copies of Certificates of Registration and Pedigrees of all breeding cats.
- ◆ Once approved by its committee, you will receive formal notification and be asked to forward applicable fee.

7. How to JOIN THE SIAMESE CAT SOCIETY OF NEW SOUTH WALES Inc.

- ◆ Complete a Membership Form which is available by either downloading from SCS website <https://www.siamesecatssociety.com>, or by contacting its Secretary or President (details on website).
- ◆ Once approved by its committee, you will receive a welcome pack and be asked to forward applicable fee.

8. How to REGISTER A KITTEN

- ◆ Complete an Application for Litter & Kitten Registration Form which is available by either downloading from your chosen registering body's website or by contacting its Registrar, Secretary or President (details on website) or your mentor.
- ◆ Only the registered breeder can make this application
- ◆ Some registering bodies have a checklist to assist you in best ensuring form and all required documents are forwarded at time of applying
- ◆ Each of the living progeny from litter must be registered
- ◆ Microchip numbers are required at time of making application
- ◆ Certificates of Sterilisation (desexing certificates) are required at time of making application unless being sold to a registered breeder
- ◆ In some instances, should you not own the stud, you will be required to provide a stud service certificate or declaration

9. How to TRANSFER BREEDERS PREFIX FROM ANOTHER ASSOCIATION

- ◆ Complete an Application for Transfer of Breeders Prefix Form which is available by either downloading from your chosen registering bodies website or by contacting its Secretary or President (details on website).
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- ◆ Some registering bodies have a checklist to assist you in best ensuring form and all required documents are forwarded at time of applying
- ◆ Each of the living progeny from litter must be registered
- ◆ Microchip numbers are required at time of making application
- ◆ Certificates of Sterilisation (desexing certificates) are required at time of making application unless being sold to a registered breeder
- ◆ In some instances, should you not own the stud, you will be required to provide a stud service certificate or declaration

12. How to REGISTER A COMPANION KITTEN or CAT

- ◆ Complete an Application for Companion Kitten or Cat Registration Form which is available by either downloading from your chosen registering body's website or by contacting its Registrar, Secretary or President (details on website) or your mentor.
- ◆ Microchip numbers are required at time of making application
- ◆ Certificates of Sterilisation (desexing certificates) are required at the time of making your application

13. How to REGISTER WITH NSW PET REGISTRY

- ◆ As a responsible breeder and/or pet owner you **MUST** register your pet in NSW. This is done via your **MyServiceNSW** account by either creating or logging in to a NSW Digital Pet Registry account
- ◆ Should you not be able to transact electronically, you can download a paper form from the NSW Pet Registry website and transact manually via your local council
- ◆ Note that late fees and fines are applicable if registration is not paid when required
- ◆ Should assistance be required please contact either your seller, NSW Pet Registry support or your local council

14. How to UPDATE REGISTERED DETAILS OF KITTEN or CAT

- ◆ Complete the relevant Application Form i.e. colour, pattern, sex, title which are available by either downloading from your chosen registering body's website or by contacting its Registrar, Secretary or President (details on website) or your mentor.

15. How to ADVERTISE YOUR CATTERY

- ◆ Most registering bodies provide the service of advertising breeds and breeders on their websites. Contact your Secretary or President (details on website) or your mentor.
- ◆ Siamese Cat Society advertises its member breeders on its website as a part of its membership fee.
- ◆ Siamese Cat Society via its Felis magazine accepts advertisements from its breeder members. Details can be forwarded via your Membership application or renewal, on which advertising rates are detailed. Contact its Secretary for assistance.

16. How to ADVERTISE KITTENS YOU HAVE FOR SALE

- ◆ Siamese Cat Society offers a free service by contacting its Kitten Registrar with your litter details. Your kitten availability information will be detailed on its website.
- ◆ If you do not have a website, consideration should be given to either designing one or having one designed/built for you.
- ◆ Other useful advertising outlets are available, each of which usually require detailing your accreditation or membership of a recognised registering body.

17. How to ENTER A CAT SHOW

- ◆ Entering a Cat Show is usually not an easy process for beginners. You are encouraged to either make contact with your mentor (if you have one), the show's secretary or your registering bodies secretary.....each of whom should provide assistance.
- ◆ Importantly:
- ◆ Read the show's schedule which will have all the rules, requirements, times etc.
- ◆ Have a copy of your exhibits Certificate of Registration
- ◆ Ensure your exhibit is up to date with vaccinations
- ◆ If you do not have a show cage you can usually hire one....details will be on show schedule or contact show's secretary
- ◆ Show cages can be sourced from Vebo cages <https://www.vebopet.com.au> Check with your mentor or association secretary as to approved dimensions
- ◆ Usually, your kitten or cat will not have been offered its morning meal prior to leaving for the show, so please remember to bring with a small meal, water, small bowl and utensils

Most Importantly:

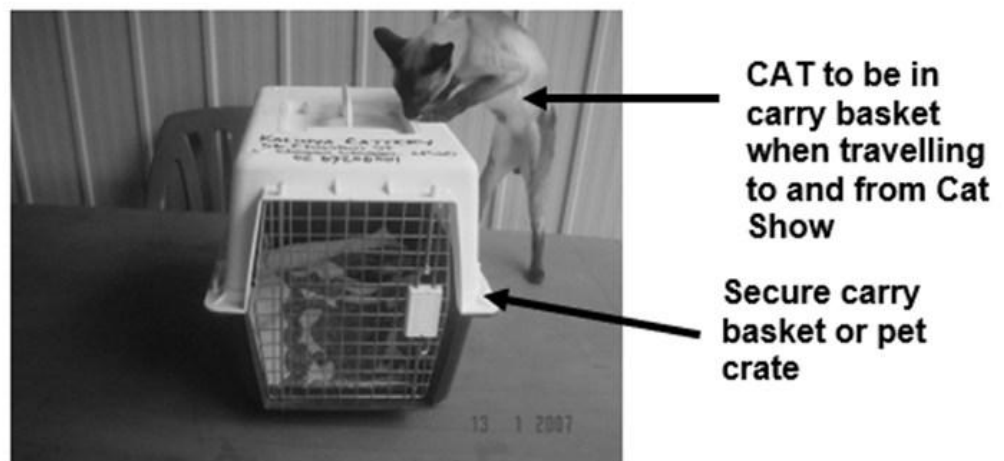
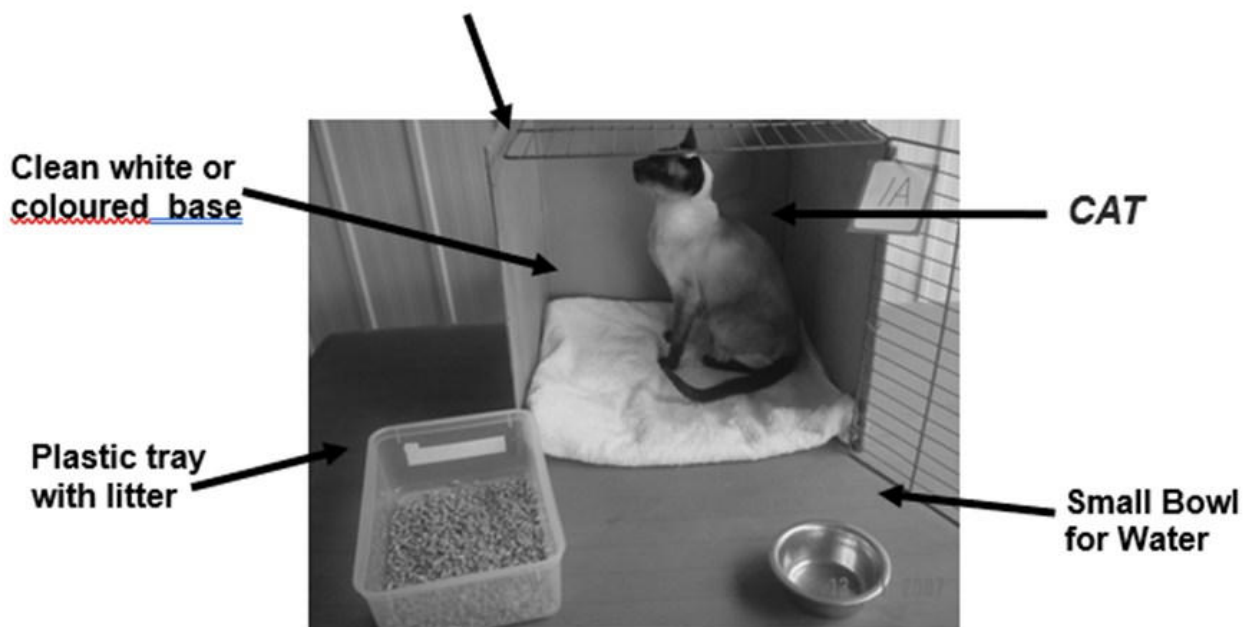
Ensure your kitten or cat is of a temperament which will enjoy the long shows days, travel to and from and the handling during assessing on the show bench.

A happy cat at home is so much better than an upset, unhappy or cranky one at a show!!

And if you want to show your cat...

What you WILL need to bring on Show Day

CURTAINS, white or coloured, can be borrowed or purchased on Show Day should you not have your own. Please check with your mentor or Show Secretary.



Remember to bring your **CURRENT VACCINATION CERTIFICATE** as issued by YOUR Vet.
